African Revival secures UK Aid Match

For 3 months from September 2014, African Revival will run an appeal to raise funds to improve the quality of Early Childhood Education for children in Northern Uganda. For the duration of the 3 month appeal the Department for International Development (DFID) will match pound for pound any donation from an individual that African Revival receives. This is a fantastic opportunity for our donors to maximise their support and for AR to make a difference to the lives of future generations in Uganda.

AR has a target of raising £250,000, which when matched will be £500,000! If we exceed our target DFID will continue to match all donations we receive, further helping the work AR does to support primary education.

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Updates from Zambia

In April 2014 AR completed and handed over a new classroom block and twin staff house to Matondo Community School in Zambia.

The new classroom block (above) contains two classrooms and an office with a built-in strong room. Exam papers and results can now be kept safely in school, the last requirement that needed to be met before Matondo can become a Government Basic School, and as a result receive government funds. The school now plans to enrol a grade 8 class for the first time too. The structure was handed over with pupil desks, and furniture for the new office.

With the new twin staff house, Matondo Community School are able to apply for 2 more government trained teachers and provide accommodation for them and their families. This will go a long way to boosting the quality of education at the school.

At the handover, the Head Teacher praised AR and our supporter for the work completed at Matondo and promised to work hard to make the school succeed!

Community Teacher Training Programme

Our teacher training sponsorship scheme in Zambia launched in April 2014. AR selected twenty existing untrained community teachers from schools we support. Over the next three years the teachers will attend the Teacher Training College in Monze. They will study during school holidays and teach at their respective schools during the term. T

AR can currently support these teachers until 2015, and we will be looking to raise funds to enable them to finish their studies and improve the quality of teaching in some of the neediest schools in Zambia.

He is a young and committed teacher who wants to see his pupils pass their grade 7 exams and carry on to secondary school: "I am so thankful for this opportunity and I will work very hard to become a government teacher after the three years at College. This will help not only me but the whole community at Muumba."

Construction Works in Zambia

AR's Zambia team has been busy so far in 2014. We have supplied 124 desks, and other furniture to Matondo, Muumba and Siamwaamvwa Community School, and we are about to complete more construction projects by the end of Spring!

We are nearing completion of classrooms at Muumba Community School and Mabuyu Basic School and the construction of a twin staff house at Musebela Community School. Next month AR will start the construction of a double VIP latrine block at Musebela, which will boost both the hygienic situation and morale at the school.

always provides materials like bricks, river sand, crushed stones and gravel, while AR provides technical support and hard to access materials, like iron sheets for the roof and door frames. This partnership with the community allows us to achieve more with our donor's money! Our next construction priority is Bwacha Basic School where we need to build a 1x3 classroom block to provide enough learning space for the 637 pupils. The community has already shown its commitment by providing enough upfront materials for the project to start any time from now!
