1. About us

This website is operated by African Revival, a charity and company limited by guarantee registered in England and Wales.

In these terms, “African Revival”, “we”, “us” and “our” refer to African Revival. “Website” means africanrevival.org and the pages and materials we operate under that domain.

2. What these terms cover

These terms govern general access to and use of our website, including reading, viewing, downloading and sharing its publicly available content.

These terms do not govern:

- donations, Gift Aid declarations or recurring donation arrangements;
- purchases from an online shop;
- entry to paid or organised events, challenges, raffles or competitions;
- applications for employment, volunteering, grants or partnerships; or
- services provided by a third-party fundraising, payment, social-media or other platform.

Those activities may be subject to separate information or terms displayed before you proceed. If there is a conflict, the specific terms for that activity take priority in relation to that activity.

3. Using our website

You may use the website only for lawful purposes and in a way that does not infringe the rights of, restrict or inhibit the use and enjoyment of the website by anyone else.

You must not:

- use the website fraudulently, maliciously or in connection with unlawful activity;
- attempt to gain unauthorised access to the website, its server, databases or connected systems;
- introduce viruses, malware, harmful code or material intended to disrupt or damage systems or data;
- conduct automated scraping, harvesting, crawling or data extraction in a way that places an unreasonable load on the website, circumvents technical controls or is otherwise unlawful;
- impersonate African Revival or another person, misrepresent an affiliation with us, or suggest our endorsement where none exists;
- use our content, name or branding for misleading, defamatory, exploitative or unlawful purposes; or
- collect or misuse personal information about website users, staff, supporters, partners or programme participants.

We may take reasonable technical or legal steps to prevent misuse and protect the website, African Revival and others.

4. Website information

We aim to keep the website accurate, useful and up to date. However, its content is provided for general information and awareness. It is not legal, financial, medical, safeguarding or other professional advice and should not be relied upon as a substitute for advice appropriate to your circumstances.

Descriptions of our work, programme results, countries, partners and funding may change. Some content may summarise complex programmes or reflect information available at the time it was prepared. Although we take reasonable care, we do not promise that all content will always be complete, current or free from error.

5. Availability and changes

The website is provided free of charge. We do not guarantee that it, or any content on it, will always be available, uninterrupted, secure or free from faults. We may suspend, withdraw, restrict or change all or part of the website for operational, security, legal or other reasons.

We may update these terms from time to time. The current version will be published on the website with its effective or review date. Continued use after an update means the revised terms apply from the stated date.

6. Intellectual property

Unless stated otherwise, African Revival owns or is licensed to use the intellectual-property rights in the website and its content, including text, design, graphics, logos, photographs, film, audio, reports and downloadable materials. Those rights are protected by copyright, trade mark and other laws.

You may:

10. Privacy and cookies

Our Privacy Notice explains how we collect and use personal information. Our Cookie Notice and cookie preference centre explain the cookies and similar technologies used by the website and allow you to manage non-essential technologies.

These documents form part of the information available to website users but do not change the scope of these Terms of Use.

11. Responsibility and liability

Nothing in these terms excludes or limits liability where it would be unlawful to do so. This includes liability for death or personal injury caused by negligence, fraud or fraudulent misrepresentation, and any rights or remedies that cannot legally be excluded.

If you use the website as a consumer, we are responsible for loss or damage that is a foreseeable result of our breach of these terms or our failure to use reasonable care and skill. We are not responsible for loss or damage that is not foreseeable, arises from circumstances outside our reasonable control, or results from your failure to follow these terms or reasonable security precautions.

The website is intended for general public and charitable information, not for business reliance. If you use it for commercial or business purposes, to the extent permitted by law we exclude liability for loss of profits, sales, business, anticipated savings, data, goodwill, reputation or business opportunity, and for indirect or consequential loss.

We do not guarantee that the website will be secure or free from bugs or viruses. You are responsible for configuring your technology, using appropriate security protection and keeping your software up to date.

12. Suspension and termination

If we reasonably believe you have breached these terms or that action is necessary to protect the website, another person or African Revival, we may restrict or block access, remove submitted material, preserve evidence, contact relevant authorities or take other proportionate action.

13. Governing law and courts

These terms and any non-contractual dispute arising from use of the website are governed by the law of England and Wales.

The courts of England and Wales will have jurisdiction. If you are a consumer resident in Scotland or Northern Ireland, you may also bring proceedings in the courts where you live, and you retain any mandatory protections given to you by the law of your country of residence.

14. General

If a court or competent authority finds part of these terms unlawful or unenforceable, the remaining provisions will continue to apply. A delay in enforcing a right does not waive that right. These terms do not give rights to anyone other than you and African Revival under the Contracts (Rights of Third Parties) Act 1999.
